Note about REINTEGRATION

Dear Met Family.

We are providing a safe and clean environment so that, when you are ready to reintegrate, we are ready for you. As you consider reintegrating into life at The Met on site, we want you to know that we are following the guidelines from both Ottawa Public Health and the Province of Ontario to create a safe and clean environment. While we are not able to present all the pre-COVID-19 ministry opportunities at this time, we are adopting a phased approach to reintegrating. We will continue to reintroduce ministries over time when it is safe to do so and when we can be certain we have the ability to maintain the levels of disinfecting. 





Visitation

The Met's Deacons care for those who are in hospital as well as those who have just come out of the hospital. They also spend time visiting those who are 'shut-in' or confined to their home environment. Deacons are also available to provide communion to those who are 'shut-in'.

Church-Wide Prayer | Last Sunday of the Month

Please make it a priority to join together as a church family to pray for our city, our country, and our world. We will take time pray for our ministries, our missionaries, and our church family. We will occasionally have guests come to share about various initiatives and ministries outside The Met.

Weekly Prayer | Wednesdays at 7PM

This gathering is led by Harold Browne, a Met Deacon, who leads the group in a time of devotion and prayer every Wednesday. He also produces a weekly prayer bulletin that is used for this meeting, as well as made available to other small groups in the church.
