But it’s so interesting to see how the Apostle Paul changes the paradigm: shepherds and teachers are given to the church family to equip all the believers (“the saints”) to go out and do the work of ministry. Tribute to Pastor Ron | Chris Shadbolt



Recently our Executive Director of Operations, Chris Shadbolt, had the special opportunity to meet with Pastor Ron and to review his 21+ years of ministry here at The Met. Pastor Ron, wife Ann, Matt, Ben, and Katie arrived in early 2000 from sunny California ready for a great adventure, with great expectations, a clear sense of calling, and an awful lot of snow. In those early days he remembered the special guidance and loving support from Pastor Randy and the Board, and the prayer for Pastor Ron in the parking lot after a board meeting with thunder and lightning all around.

Pastor Ron said there were several highlights in his years of ministry but one of the most memorable was the tremendous support from the army of dedicated volunteers. Looking way back to The Met's first VBC in the crowded Bank Street location, volunteers stepped up to assist with over 400 kids in attendance! There were even more surprises along the way; Pastor Ron shared about the abundance and absolute delight on the children's faces, who as joyful young givers at VBC raised \$7,800 for missions! However, Ministry was not without its challenges. When the move to 2176 Prince of Wales in 2009 was completed, Pastor Ron found himself on the edge of burnout but was again prayerfully supported and encouraged by Met church family.

We wrapped up our conversation with Pastor Ron sharing his favourite, life-changing passage of scripture from Psalm 78, v1-8. He shared passionately about the command to teach the children, and how we should not hide the biblical truths from our children, nor tell the story incorrectly, nor forget to tell the story. This pivotal passage moved Pastor Ron to tears and led him to prioritizing the teaching of the Truth so fervently for so many years. He served as the Children's Ministry Pastor for most of his time here and after leading well in this capacity, he took on the pastoral leadership of families and men.

Wrapping up our conversation, I asked Pastor Ron what he wished he had known when he arrived. He responded that there was no good, inexpensive, authentic Mexican food around! Well done, Pastor Ron. Well done!
