What excites me about The Met's mission...

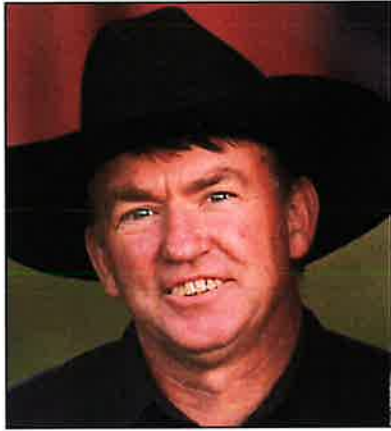
