Discussion Questions - Noah's Ark

- 1. **Discuss** How did "revisiting" the Noah's ark story change your perspective of it? If it was new to you, what surprised you? What remaining questions do you have?
- 2. **Dig** In Genesis 6:5-6, we're told that the corruption in the world led God to "regret" that he had made humanity and that the sin and "wickedness" of humanity "grieved him to his heart."

What do you make of God's response to sin here? How does it affect your heart?

- 3. **Do** The sermon asked, "How can we know that we God?"
 - What role does obedience play in your life today?
 - What are some ways you can practically grow in your love for God and neighbor this week?

Guided Prayer Points – After sharing prayer requests with your group, pray for them along with the following:

- 1. Praise God that he is the Creator of all things.
- **2. Confess to God** that you have sin, wickedness, evil, and corruption living in your hearts. Apologize to him for the grief you have caused him because of these things.
- **3. Thank God** that the ultimate flood of his judgment came down on Jesus so that we could be protected, saved, and shut into God's eternal ark.
- **4. Ask God** to help you to love him enough to obey his commandments.

Unreached People Group of the Week – Ghosi [KOH-see] (Hindu Traditions) in India

The Ghosi name comes from the Sanskrit word ghush, which means "to shout." The reason for this is that the Ghosi are herdsmen who are noted for shouting as they herd their cattle. The Ghosi live mainly in parts of India with few Christian believers. Few will ever meet someone who lives the abundant life offered by Jesus Christ. There are 333,000 Ghosi in India. They have no current Evangelical, Bible-believing adherent among them. They do have the complete Bible available to them in their language, but their access to the gospel materials is very scarce. Pray that workers would bring gospel materials to them and for their salvation.¹
