- I. Union with Christ: What is it?
 - Wayne Grudem: "Union with Christ is a phrase used to summarize several different relationships between believers and Christ, through which Christians receive every benefit of salvation. These relationships include the fact that:
 - 1) We are in Christ
 - 2) Christ is in us
 - 3) We are like Christ
 - 4) We are with Christ"

What does "in" mean in these cases? (not spatial)

- Connection with Christ (relational, spiritual)
- Union with Christ (mystical)¹
- "Union with Christ is the reality of all the ways that the Bible pictures our human connectedness to Christ in which he is indispensable for every good that we enjoy." John Piper

V. Union with Christ: Implications⁴

- Putting off the old self, Repentance, Aiming at God's glory (Col 3:1-17; 1 Cor 6:15-20)⁵
- Confidence/Assurance of divine blessing (Eph 1:3) "Since Christ has been so imparted to you with all his benefits that all his things are made yours, that you are made a member of him, indeed one with him, his righteousness overwhelms your sins; his salvation wipes out your condemnation; with his worthiness he intercedes that your unworthiness may not come before God's sight. Surely this is so: We ought not to separate Christ from ourselves or ourselves from him. Rather, we ought to hold fast bravely with both hands to that fellowship by which he has bound himself to us." John Calvin
- A desire to see unbelievers saved (Rom 9:1-4)
- Dying and Grieving Well (1 Thess 4:14-16)⁶
- Spiritual Strength (Phil 4:13, 19)
- Spiritual Fruit (John 15:4-5)

- Hope for future resurrection (Col 3:1-4)
